

Local resident Cullin Tobin is sick and tired of people not picking up after their pets. He is doing something about it. Cullin initiated an educational campaign to remind his neighbors to pick up after their pets. The campaign is centered around a very simple slogan, "Hey you, don't be a \$h!T head, scoop that poop."

Cullin, along with the **Arts District BID**, will be distributing stickers throughout the neighborhood. Additionally, the **Arts District Little Tokyo Neighborhood Council** has purchased six pet waste stations, which the BID will be installing and servicing.

The pet stations and signs will be located on 2nd, 3rd, and Traction Streets. If the pilot program works, more pet stations will be installed.

Directional Closure of Center Street

Effective immediately, expect directional closures on Center Street from Banning to Commercial Streets.
